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- Shared political, institutional, and demographic features of Australia, the UK and Canada
- Role of Labour parties and class voting in Australia and the UK
- Canadian political parties more overlapping and less ideologically distinct

# CASE STUDY: AUSTRALIA

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- Early 1970s: Expansion under Labour government
- Late 1980s: Labour expands funding to for-profit services

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- Early 1990s: Conservatives introduce voucher system
- 1997: Labour introduces the National Child Care Strategy


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- Early 1970s: Welfare services option added to CAP


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
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
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- 1966: Liberals introduce CAP
